



Father Jamie's Reflection



In this second reflection on angels, I would like to share with you the guardian angels. As I mentioned in the previous reflection, the guardian angels are in the bottom choir of the nine choirs of angels. The guardian angels are very special, because there is one guardian angel assigned to each human, they even accompany us to heaven when we die. We hear about them throughout Scripture, even Jesus mentions us having guardian angels.

I cannot stress enough how we should definitely take advantage of our guardian angels. They are with us at all times and all we have to do is ask them and they will help us. They want to help us. It is so amazing that God loves us so much that he has created a special friend to go with us forever. A couple of things to remember, is first off, angels cannot read our minds, so when we want to ask them something, we have to audibly ask out loud. Second of all, even though they cannot read our minds, they can read our body language and they can put thoughts in our heads if we asked them to. Of course whether they do it or not is their decision. If we try our best to build a relationship with our guardian angel, this helps with our relationship with God, because the guardian angels mission is to help get us to heaven to God. Oh myself, I talk to my angel a lot. Sometimes you may have noticed I seem like I'm doing quiet prayers under my breath, at times when this is not in the proper place of the mass, then you configure I am probably talking to my angel to help me with something during the liturgy. I especially ask my angel to help me when it comes to remembering things.

A question that I hear asked about guardian angels quite frequently, is if it is OK for us to name our guardian angel? I will say, that is up to you. I do not think it is right or wrong to name your angel. I don't have a name for my own Angel, I just referred to the angel, as angel. My angel knows when I'm addressing it.

A couple of stories I will leave you with, one my own experience and the other, one of my friends. When I had the flu during the winter, I was so sick, that I could not pray my prayers. My mind simply could not focus long enough, but when I slept, I dreamed of doing my prayers, which told me, my guardian angel was praying them for me on my behalf. All priests, Nance, deacons and religious, I required to pray the liturgy of the hours, we either make a vowel or promise to do this. Tradition tells us that there are certain angels who help remind us to do these prayers and if we are for some reason physically not able to as I was with the flu, my guardian angel can do it for me. What a great gift the guardian angel is. One of my friends, who is now a religious sister in Spain, was attending world youth day in Spain several years ago and she was trying to find a friend that she knew. There were literally 1 million people where she was and her friend was somewhere in that crowd. There was no way she could find her friend on her own, so she asked her guardian angel to locate her friends guardian angel and help bring them together. They found each other within five minutes. I say it again, take advantage of having the guardian angel. This is just another way God shows his love for us.


The **Silent Auction** is in need of baskets and gift cards. Can you donate items for a basket or ask some business to donate a basket? It is not too early to ask.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

One of the great treasures of the Eastern tradition is the icon of the Holy Trinity created by the Russian iconographer Andrei Rublev in the 1400s. The Trinity is symbolized by the three travelers to the tent of Abraham and Sarah. They are seated at a table blessing a cup of wine, under the oak of Mamre. If you look closely, you will see a sacrificed calf in the chalice, reminding the viewer of the cross. The table, prepared for eating and tilted toward the viewer, is an invitation to the Eucharist. From left to right, each figure is keyed to a person of the Trinity. Like all icons, this image is theology in art. The persons are equal in proportion and dignity, they all carry staffs to symbolize their power, and are shown with golden wings and halos. Today, the best place to see Rubley's work is the Holy Trinity Cathedral, at the heart of the vast Holy Trinity monastery about an hour from Moscow. After decades of persecution, it is now once again a living monastery, a world heritage site, and the spiritual home of Russian Orthodoxy. A Google visit is highly recommended today!
