

# A Message from Father John Thomas

#### My Dear Parishioners:

Hello to you before I arrive as your pastor. I first tell you how since Bishop Medley called me to this transfer, I have fervently prayed for you, your families, the parishes of Holy Spirit, Bowling Green, Blessed Sacrament Chapel, and St. Stephen Cathedral, Fr. Jerry Riney, and lastly (but no less fervent) myself. I am very much aware it was not time for a 'move' and this has caused modifications and change in both parishes.

The beginning of June I met with Fr. Sinoj and Sr. Jeannette so we could begin the process of getting to know one another and speak about the best way to move forward. #### LIVE THE LITURGY

God calls us to bring His Word to all corners of the earth. What does that mean for you and me? We are just simple and humble folks trying to find our way through the Gospel and our world. After all, we are not professional preachers but gentle servants. Jesus summons us to take his message on the road and bring it from the pew to the pavement. We cannot keep the joy of the Gospel to ourselves but must bring it into every aspect of our lives: our families, our schools, our work, our corporations, our politics, our social circles, and our philosophies. We cannot just accept the wisdom of the world as true and conduct our lives as if the Good News is a separate matter. They are one. Jesus never asked his friends to go and construct buildings where people could come to hear the truth. He asked them to go to their homes and meet them one on one. face to face. When the rubber meets the road and the message is challenging, rejection is quite possible. That's the litmus test for whether we're really doing what we have been asked.

#### **Trusting the Lord**

Jesus sent the disciples "two by two" and instructed them to take "no food, no sack, no money in their belts". Today's Gospel doesn't mention whether the disciples grumbled or balked, but it does tell us that they followed the Lord's will. Imagine how we might react if Jesus asked us to embark on a journey today without money, credit cards, cell phones, snacks, and all the other things we think we would need! What incredible trust they had in the Lord, that their needs would be met. It can sometimes feel daunting to place our trust in the Lord and believe that He will take care of our needs.


#### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

At the time of the Reformation, although England broke away from papal authority under Henry VIII, a silent majority clung to the Catholic faith. Henry's eldest daughter, Mary, restored the "old religion" in a fierce persecution of Protestants (she is called "Bloody Mary" for good reason.) His youngest daughter, Elizabeth, rejected papal ties. Under her reign, beginning with legislation in 1593, Catholics were persecuted again, and only the very wealthy could afford the fines for not attending Anglican services on Sunday. They were called "recusants," from a Latin word meaning "refuse," since they refused to attend the liturgy of the Church of England. Many families maintained Catholic tradition in secret, and today their descendants claim "Recusancy" as a mark of family pride. For generations they sent their young people abroad to be educated in convents and monasteries. It is not surprising that the first monastery in colonial America springs from Holland with the daughters of patrician English recusant families. Port Tobacco, Maryland, proved fruitful soil for the Carmelite tradition.
